Buying a PC by Ray Francis

There are so many choices when it comes to buying computers that it can all be frustrating and overwhelming.

There are a few important things to think about before you start shopping.

- What will I use the computer for (now and in the future)?
- What is my budget?
- Desktop or Laptop

The trick is to buy something that meets your needs exactly, something that gives you the opportunity to grow without breaking the bank.

First you need to think about what you are going to need the computer for. Are you going to want to take digital photos, use the Internet and so on.

Do you want to install any Special Access software, or connect Special Access devices?

Do you want to use your PC for writing letters and doing your home accounts?

Do you want to be able to take the machine with you when you travel?

You also may have a budget in mind at this point – stick to it-Do not go above your budget limit-It is too easy to carried away!

Do your research and get the information on 'Recommended Requirements' for the software and PC specification.

It is good to take some time over the purchase - visit a few shops and compare what they have to offer

When entering the great "Retail World" of purchasing a PC, ask the following questions-

What level of support can the retailer offer? What after sales services is free? Is there on-site detailed, friendly advice if I need it? Do I need an Extended Warranty?

The choice of PC or Laptop is a difficult one to make as there is a wide range of models available in both. It may be that you are already familiar with one of the systems, or that your child's school uses one or the other of them. If you are completely new to computers, try both out and see which one you feel more comfortable with.

Unless you definitely know that you are going to want to take the computer with you when you travel for example, I would recommend sticking with a desktop machine, as they are usually around half the cost for the same specification - leaving you more money for a colour printer, camera, scanner, software and so on.

You should try and "Tick as many of your boxes" within your budget.

A Multimedia PC is usually a term used by shops to indicate a package of equipment that may include a computer, monitor, printer, scanner and digital camera.

Don't get carried away. Make sure the computer meets your specification - that is the most important part

You will also need to choose your operating system. This will commonly be a Microsoft Windows XP or Vista and you should choose one of these if in doubt.

bundled Free scanners and printers are the epitome of false economies in almost all cases. You can't expect great printers performance, cheap auzzle ink like there's tomorrow, and in fact it's better if you budget for whichever device you need and choose it properly - don't be fooled by pushy Sales People

If you can't find an off-the-shelf machine that suits you, ask for a quote on a computer designed to your specifications. Most retailers will happily oblige. Check out the following before finalising your purchase

Monitor, Operating system, Your PC or Laptop, Delivery, Credit Card Surcharges, Warranty, Parts and Labour, Free bundles, VAT in the prices is included
