
centre of the gardens as well as a few wandering peacocks.

INFORMATION FOR CARERS

Caring for a disabled or elderly person can be difficult and stressful but there is help available.

Carer's Allowance - is a benefit to help a person who looks after someone that is disabled. You don't have to be related to, or live with, the person you care for. To find out if you are eligible and how to claim you can contact the Carer's Allowance Unit or your local Job Centre Plus office.

Local Authority Carers Services. Carers' Assessments

If you are caring for someone on a 'regular and substantial' basis you have the right in law to ask social services to carry out a Carers A Carer's Assessment Assessment. should be a full discussion of your own needs as far as education, training and work are concerned as well as any health problems or other commitments that you have. You should be told the outcome of the assessment and, if you are offered services, you should have the option choosing between services of arranged directly for you or receiving a direct payment to purchase your own services.

Carers' Direct Payments

The majority of direct payments are paid to a disabled person to pay for care. However in some cases a carer might be able to get a payment to buy services that help them. Guidance given to local councils suggests that they can give Carers Direct Payments for any purpose which helps them to sustain their role as a carer and promotes their own health and wellbeing. Social workers are encouraged to be imaginative in thinking about the ways direct payments might be used and carers have been awarded them to pay for:

- Taxi fares: Mobile phones
- Computers: Gym club membership
- Leisure classes: Training courses
- Counselling: Driving lessons
- Help with housework or gardening

Register your carer status with your practice.

Book an appointment to see your GP if your caring role is affecting your health. They should be able to tell you about the help available for carers.

For example you will be able to meet a member of staff from Carers in Bedfordshire Mental Health Team each Wednesday.
