












# **Christmas Party. Priory Marina**, 10th December 2014.

### **Review of FLAG Policies on Events.**

From time to time the FLAG Committee review our "Policies and Procedures" to ensure we are giving FLAG members the best service we can while ensuring FLAG is sustainable for the future. The Committee would like to take this opportunity to refresh memories and clarify our policies regarding trips and events. During the FLAG year (April-March) we aim to run up to 7 events.

#### Flyers.

- Flyers will be sent out around 4 to 5 weeks before the event and replies are due back 2 to 3 weeks before the event.
- Each Flyer will have a reply date clearly printed on it.
- We really need to know if you want to come as soon as possible.
- Flyers received late will only be actioned subject to the discretion of the Committee.

### Payments.

- Payment is required the same day as the reply.
- If you cannot pay at this time, speak to a member of the Committee as we can often help **but it** is important that we know you want to come.
- If you are bringing a carer or friend with you their payment is also due.

### Subsidised Prices.

- Over the financial year FLAG aims to subsidise events by 40%, for example if the cost of an event is £10 per member, each member will pay £6 and FLAG will pay £4 per member.
- Only members and carers qualify for subsidised prices. Non-members or friends have to pay the full price.

### Transport.

- Transport can only be provided if you have no other way of getting to or from an event. FLAG
  cannot provide or pay for transport if you <u>choose</u> not to make your own there, for example,
  because you want a drink.
- If you are unable to provide your own transport FLAG will provide either a Volunteer Driver or a Taxi to get you to the event.
- As FLAG has limited funds we can only pay up to £20 per person, per event, for taxi fares.
- For trips where we hire a wheelchair friendly coach there are normally only five wheelchair spaces so its 'first come, first served'.
- We cannot pay for transport for non-members, friends or carers.
- We do not provide Volunteer Drivers for members who live outside of Bedford Borough.

#### <u>Meals.</u>

 When FLAG goes for a meal in a restaurant drinks are extra and should be paid by yourselves and not put on FLAG's bill!

#### **Event Volunteers.**

- We encourage our members to be as independent as possible with Volunteers only providing support including driving members to events, pushing wheelchairs, accompanying members, serving meals, fetching a drink from the bar and so on.
- Volunteers are not trained or insured to provide 'Personal Care'. This includes things like assistance with dressing, washing, toileting, eating, drinking or taking medication. If you do need 'Personal Care' at an event please bring a carer along with you.

### **Event Refunds.**

- If you have said you wish to come to an event but then are unable to attend please let us know as soon as possible.
- If you let us know two weeks before the event, or before we have paid for events tickets, we will refund your payment.
- If you cancel at any other time a refund is not normally possible as we may have paid for event tickets etc. However refunds can be made at the Committee's discretion.
