## Community Transport - Door to Door

The BRCC
(Bedfordshire Rural
Communities Charity) is Bedfordshire's
only countywide
Community
Transport provider,
one of its services is
outlined below:

Door to Door.

I'm sure you have all heard of Door to Door, It provides wheelchair accessible minibuses for people unable to use public transport in the Bedford area. Their aim is to provide a safe, accessible service for those who are unable to use ordinary public transport due to disability, either temporary or permanent. The staff and volunteers of Door to Door aim to provide at all times a reliable, personal and friendly service, allowing added freedom and independence. However, they only provide their service Monday - Friday, 8.30am to 4.15pm and not evenings or

weekends.

Charge - as from 1st June 2015, because of rising costs and demands on the service they have introduced a charge of £1 per journey (£2 return). They will also be charging £2.50 for journeys that are cancelled later than 1pm the previous day.

Concessionary
Bus Pass - Along
with other groups
and individuals
FLAG has been
campaigning for
disabled people to
use their Bus Pass
on regular Bus
services as well as
Door to Door
services. After
some wrangling with
the Council an

agreement has been made. As long as a disabled person meets the qualifying criteria they can use their Bus Pass on regular Buses and become a member of Door to Door and use their services at a cost of £1.00 per journey.

Membership - £20 first year and £15 annually thereafter. Booking line -Mon - Fri, 9am-1pm - Tel: 01234 271087 to book for the next day.

# Tower of London Trip - 10th September

On the morning of Thursday 10th September, FLAG members congregated outside the White Horse Pub (due to Priory being otherwise engaged) to set off for the Tower of London. This trip was a momentous one as it was the first coach trip for the new FLAG mascot – Jeff the Bear.

The weather was beautiful and there was an air of excitement as we set off in Motts coach. The journey was a long one with lots of delays, this being due in part to the celebrations of Queen Elizabeth II

becoming Britain's longest running monarch in History. Once we finally arrived, we all got our tickets and went our separate ways, to explore the historic wonders of the Tower.

The Tower of London is approaching 1000 years and while bits were added later at various historic periods unfortunately none of these periods were particularly disability aware. FLAG members are made of strong stuff and we braved the cobbles and made our way to see the ravens,

crown jewels and Beefeaters. The history of the tower can't help but have an effect. seeing Traitors' Gate and the poignant memorial to those beheaded in the Tower grounds, really brings it home that these were real people and real events - not just stories to entertain.

At the end of the day we all met up to come back home, we were tired, those in wheelchairs and with rollators were thoroughly shaken with the cobbles – but at least no one was beheaded!
