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
Lisa Thomas (taking a break).

FLAG Funding News 2017/18.

The Panacea Charitable Trust.

This Trust is managed by the local Bedfordshire and Luton Community Foundation. Their aim is to provide grants for projects run by community groups based in, or working for, the benefit of people in the town of Bedford. In 2011 the Trust gave us a grant of £2000, in 2016 they gave us a grant of £3149. This year they have kindly given us £3000 to be used for our Administrators Salary and to Hire the Room at the Church on Thursday Afternoons.

The Neighbourly Charitable Trust.

In 2011 this Trust gave us £500 towards a Narrowboat Trip which several members enjoyed. This year they have given us another Grant of £500 which will be put into our General Funds to be used for either Event or Running Costs.

The Co-op Local Community Fund.

Local Co-ops have made FLAG one of their 3 charities for the 6 months from May

to October 2017. The other two being "Autism Bedfordshire" and the "Kings Arms Project". When Co-op members spend money on selected own brand products and services 1% goes to the charity they choose. We were presented with a cheque for £333.33 at the opening of the new Co-op in Queens Drive and are expecting a further donation from them at the end of October.


FLAG would like to thank everybody for their generous donations. FLAG and all its members are extremely grateful for their donations which will be put to good use.

With almost a full coach of 32 FLAG members we journeyed to Shepreth Wildlife Park on the 5th of July. The weather was good to us as the sun shone all day. We left Bedford at 9.40am, stopped to pick Brendan up in St Neots, and arrived at the Park just before 11.00am. We split into groups and headed in different directions.



I started off going around with Kaye, Hannah, Russell and my carer Shellah. We saw Prairie Dogs, Alpaca and a couple of Dartmoor Ponies, then came across a few Wallaby and Emu. The Meerkats were out and about but the Red Squirrel, Maned Wolf and the White Lipped Tamarin were hiding

in the undergrowth of their enclosures. The Porcupine

were not hiding and were a lot bigger than I expected.

I lost the other three but bumped into Laura and we headed off to see the Egyptian Fruit Bats. They were in a specially designed Nocturnal House which was kept almost completely dark. The Bats flew above our heads and we felt the wind from their wings. The Lynx, the Ring -Tailed-Lemur and the Macaque were also in hiding so we decided to break for lunch at the "Jungle Cafe". The meal was really nice but the service was a bit slow.

At 1.30 we went along to the Birds of Prey talk and met "Lurch" the Eagle
