
The coach, with Steve the driver, left from the White Horse pub about

At the railway station Gerard, Kelly and Ann try to push the luggage trolley through the wall to get to Platform 9^{3/4} and to the Hogwarts Express.















The cost of The Harry Potter Studio tour trip.

The following table shows how much the trip actually cost. The total cost of the trip was £1315.00 with FLAG paying £895.00 and members paying £420..00 FLAG paid a big 68% subsidy for this trip.

We asked members to pay £20.00 each. The actual tickets were £40.00 each, so even without the cost of the coach you got a really good deal. If FLAG did not pay any money towards the trip it would cost each member £62.00 which I think you would agree is too much.

Charging for Events.

Setting a fair price for events is one of the hardest tasks the Trustees have to do. FLAG aims to subsidise events by 40% with Members paying 60%. The subsidy for 2018-19 was closer to 51% for FLAG and 49% for Members. In addition to the subsidy many members benefit from having their taxi fares reimbursed or transport to and from events by our dedicated volunteers. FLAG also has many hidden costs such as Room Hire at Priory, Insurance, Administrator Salary, Printing, Stamps, the list goes on. Most of these expenses we try to cover with Grants which are often for very specific purposes (restricted) and we are unable to spend the money on anything else.

Below is a summary of FLAGs policies on how and why we set event prices:

Coaches.

This has to be one of our biggest expenses and usually costs around £600 to £700. Where possible FLAG aims to obtain Grants for our coach and if lucky enough to to do this then this cost does not feature in the event cost for Members (but of course the FLAG bank balance goes down).

Room/Venue Hire.

FLAG applies for funding for our weekly meetings but not events. For example the Room Hire for our AGM and Fish and Chip supper, held at Priory, does form part of the event cost. In order for us to enjoy our lovely, spacious Christmas Meal FLAG had to pay for a minimum of 46 people. We didn't get 46 attendees so the difference was justified as Room Hire.

Tickets / Menu Prices.

FLAG often has to pay for tickets in advance, this is really hard as we do not know how many people are coming. Harry Potter tickets were £40 per person, we had to order them two months in advance. Indications from the events choices we did last year suggested it was going to be popular so FLAG purchased 38 tickets (the number of people we can fit on a coach). However, only 28 people attended, fortunately we managed to get a refund, Phew!

Carer Prices.

It is FLAG's policy that if a member needs a carer then that carer comes for the same subsidised price as the member. We have this policy as for the vast majority of events there is a cost for that carer. The vast majority of people with a disability do get some contribution towards the care they need, this also includes the Trustees! When we looked into dropping participation costs for carers it was discovered that nearly £5 would have to be added to every event cost to members, the Committee all felt this was unfair.

Volunteer Costs.

The difference between a volunteer and carer is a carer is there to assist 1 person, a volunteer is devoting their time for free, is available to assist any FLAG member who needs it and often transporting members before and after events using their own cars. For this reason the cost of the volunteers is included in event prices.

Taxi Fares.

Although taxi fares generally don't come under event charges there have recently been some changes. At Christmas it became apparent that while the £20 per event covered members who could transfer or get into a standard taxi, it did not cover the additional cost of a wheelchair taxi. Last year only wheelchair users contributed to their taxi costs of more than £20. FLAG did not feel this was fair so the new taxi policy is:

- FLAG will pay up to £20 per event for a standard taxi.
- FLAG will pay up to £40 for a wheelchair taxi.
- Charges are per taxi not number of people in the taxi.
- Out of Borough members receive the same taxi subsidy as those who live within the Borough.
